Something of a mystery surrounds Art: it has no external purpose or practical use, but originates purely from the inner needs of a human being. On the other hand its effectiveness can enrich life, bring beauty or cause rejection but it awakens consciousness and elevates the human being. In his lectures on „Art as Seen in the Light of Mystery Wisdom“ (CW 275) Rudolf Steiner describes how the fine, visual and musical arts are related to various aspects of our human nature. By opening these arts to our senses we nourish our inner life.

We would like to investigate the specific relationships of architecture, sculpture, painting, music, poetry and eurhythm, not only to being and becoming human, but also focus on the contemporary relevance of each form of art-expression. We begin to understand the artistic themes and their styles, constantly evolving and confronting the needs of our time. With today's digitalisation and transhumanism we have entered an age that demands complete new answers from people and art.

Nowadays you neither need craftsmanship nor apparent creativity to produce so-called works of art, but will these creations appeal to the human heart and awaken us inwardly? Rudolf Steiner draws attention to art's ability to further the world's development or to put it in another way, the spiritual beings active in creating the world help transform the world by supporting artistic activity in a human being. Thus the idea that we and the world evolve through art becomes existentially significant. We look forward to exchanging ideas, keeping Rudolf Steiner's overall view of the arts at the back of our minds.

Yaike Dunselman

Studied architecture at the Alanus University for Art and Society in Alfter near Bonn in Germany. Together with Lars Frerichs, they founded and lead the Dutch-German architectural bureau "neun grad architektur" in Amersfoort/ NL and Oldenburg/ D in 2003,. The architectural bureau has 25 fellow employees and works on projects in the fields between such opposites as super-markets and the Goetheanum.

Gioia Falk

Goia Falk has been a member of the Goetheanum Eurythmy Stage since 1987. Since 2011 she led projects and rehearsals with children, adults and professional artists of drama and music, as well as being the artistic director of the Mystery Dramas at the Goetheanum. From 2014-19 she served as General Secretary of the Anthroposophical Society in Germany. Currently she has returned to Dornach to become a member of the management team of the Goetheanum Eurythmy Stage.

Christian Ginat

Studied the viola in Paris and eurythmy in Dornach. He worked for many years with the Goetheanum Stage. Performances of mainly more recent compositions, especially in connection with newly developed string instruments - "Streichseptett Heiligengerg" and others - and with expanded tonality - Heiner Ruland, Johann Sonnleitner, Rudi Spring and others.

Dr. phil. Christiane Haid

Christiane Haid studied educational science, German language and literature, history and art in Freiburg and Hamburg. In 1993 she joined the Friedrich von Hardenberg-Institute in Heidelberg. In 2001 Christiane Haid became a member of Section for the Literary Arts and Humanities and its leader in 2012. In 2006 she joined the Albert Steffen Foundation. 2012 doctoral thesis: "Myth, Dream and Imagination. The Little Myths of Albert Steffen". 2009-2019 managing director of the Publishing House "Verlag am Goetheanum" and from 2019 onwards its programme director. 2020 head of the Fine Arts Section.

Prof. Dr. phil. Roland Halfen

Studied philosophy, art history and archaeology in Freiburg i. Br. and Munich. Since 2002 a staff member of the Rudolf Steiner Archive in Dornach (publication of Rudolf Steiner's artistic work), since 2012 professor of art history and cultural history at the Stuttgart Free University / Seminar for Waldorf Education.

Adrien Jutard

Studied history and geography, art and painting. 2002 diploma at the Strasbourg School of Art; 2006 diploma at the Assenza School of Painting. Since 2006 freelance artist, numerous exhibitions (painting, graphics, installations, sculpture) in Switzerland, France and Germany, including Art in Construction projects. 2011 awarded the annual work contribution by canton Solothurn. 2007-2017 Teacher for visual design at the Rudolf Steiner School Basel. In 2019 he became the editorial graphic designer for the weekly magazine "Das Goetheanum".

Gotthard Killian

Gotthard Killian was trained as a Cellist and a flautist. He was for a long time a musician at the Goetheanum. Author of "The Monochord School of Pythagoras (Kathleen Schlesinger's rediscovery of the Ancient Greek scales)". As a composer he also uses scales of the musical-mathematical complex of the Platonic World Year. He composes for drama and eurythmy.

Walter Kugler

Walter Kugler studied music for schools, German history, pedagogy and political science. Having completed his PhD he taught at at Cologne University and then he became a professor for Fine Arts at Oxford Brookes University. He was involved in editing and in the publication of Rudolf Steiner's Complete Works Edition for more than three decades. In cooperation with museums worldwide he curated numerous exhibitions with Steiner's blackboard drawings as well as being actively engaged as an author.

Michael Kurtz

Michale Kurtz was leader of the music department in the Section for the Arts of Speech and Music at the Goetheanum from 2001-2018. Courses, lectures, conferences at the Goetheanum (with Gubaidulina, Hosokawa, Saariaho, among others) and in various countries. Research on music since early modern times, i.e. on Gubaidulina, Rudolf Steiner's musical impulses and the effects of music on human beings.

Frederiek Nelissen

Studied art in Amsterdam; She has been working as a freelance painter since 1985. Several picture cycles are available in book form; most recently the cycle on "Faust" which was published as "an inspiring human being". Through her art, Nellissen tries to grasp what is in the making, what is in the process of being created. The source of inspiration is the world of processes, transformations and developments - the outer form becomes an inner movement.

Joachim Pfeffinger

From 1972-1980 he studied flute playing with Josef Paschek of the SWR and from 1994-1998 with Prof. Philippe Racine in Basel. Since then he has played in various ensembles, orchestras (currently first flute in the Arlesheim orchestra), as a soloist and also as a composer. He works in Basel as a full-time architect.

Alexander Schaumann

Alexander Schaumann studied painting. He works with adults and also in the Waldorfkindergarten in Germany and China. He is a member of the executive board of the anthroposophical society in Nordrhein Westphalen Germany.

Catherine Ann Schmid

Catherine Ann Schmid studied creative speech and drama (Bodensee/Goetheanum Dornach). She worked with the Goetheanum Stage since 1984 and had an interlude in Rome for four years.

As a freelance actor since 2011, she accompanies Eurythmy und develops her own projects and since 2014 works as a theatre pedagogue. She plays the role of Maria in the Mystery Dramas at the Goetheanum.

Barbara Schnetzler

is a freelance sculptor living in Basel and Mülhouse. She trained as a sculptor at the Sculpture School in Müllheim. Regular exhibitions at home and abroad. Her works are represented in various galleries, various private collections and in public spaces. From 2020 on she will represent sculpture in the visual Arts Section together with Rik ten Cate and curate the exhibition activities at the Goetheanum.

Rik ten Cate

For 42 years as a class teacher, art teacher and in school management at a Waldorf School. He was responsible for anthroposophy In Teacher's training courses. . He became a member of the General Anthroposophical Society in 1985 and in 1994 a class reader in the School for Spiritual Science. He has been a board member of the Dutch Anthroposophical Society (AViN) since 2014, and its General Secretary since 2019. In 1990 he became involved in the Dutch department of the Visual Arts Section, from 2004 to 2019 Section Coordinator; and from 2010 to 2014 Section Coordinator of the Visual Arts Section (SBK) in Dornach, Switzerland.

Pieter van der Ree

Pieter van der Ree studied architecture at the Technical University in Delft (NL). Since 1990 an independent architect in the field of ecological building and organic design. Publications on the interaction between man and architecture, on organic building - "Organic Architecture" (2000); 2003 curator of the travelling exhibition on "Organic Architecture, Man and Nature as Inspiration for Building". Since 2005 he has held the chair for organic architecture at the Alanus University of Arts and Sciences near Bonn.

Methods of payment/confirmation

On receipt of a group application, the respective institution will receive the account for the group. Subsequent bookings can only be applied for and paid on an individual basis.

Credit cards (all countries): The full amount will be charged to your credit card as soon as your booking has been processed. You will receive postal or email confirmation of your booking and payment.

Invoice Switzerland: Confirmation of booking and an invoice will be sent to you once your booking has been processed. Please note that we only send out invoices up until 10 days before the beginning of an event. After that, payment is only possible by credit card or on arrival.

Invoice Eurozone: Confirmation of booking and an invoice will be sent to you once your booking has been processed (Euro account). Please note that we only send out invoices up until 14 days before the beginning of an event. After that, payment is only possible by credit card or on arrival.

Other countries: Once your booking has been processed you will receive a confirmation by post or email. The amount due will either be charged to your credit card or you can pay on arrival. Bank transfers are not possible.

Please note that the conference fee must be paid before the conference starts.

Conference tickets: Tickets can be collected at the Reception until half an hour before the conference starts, also if you pay on arrival. We accept cash (Euro and CHF), VISA, MasterCard, ec-direct and Postcard-Schweiz.

Cancellation: Bookings may be cancelled free of charge up to 14 days prior to the beginning of the conference (7.5.2020 date of posting). After that, 50% of the conference fee will be charged.
